



CITIZENSHIP THURSDAY!

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION FOR THE CITIZENSHIP APPLICATION

Passport(s) and/or Travel Document(s) for the last **5 YEARS** (current and expired)

Legal Permanent Residence and **Social Security** card

Money order/Check/Credit Card for \$725 or Medicaid/SNAP Letter. Please ask us for a sample.

Addresses – List of **ALL** the addresses where you have lived in the last **5 YEARS**, including when you lived at each address (month and year).

Employers and Schools – List of **ALL** your employers and/or schools in the last **5 YEARS**, including the addresses, dates when you worked/studied in each place, and your occupation.

Selective Service registration number – If you are male and lived in the United States between the ages of 18 and 26 as a Legal Permanent Resident.

Spouse – Date of marriage, date of birth and the name of his/her employer. If s/he is a Legal Permanent Resident, alien (residency) number is needed. If current spouse is a naturalized American citizen, date and place of naturalization (copy of naturalization certificate). Bring your current marriage certificate with a translation, if it's not in English.

Previous marriages – If *you or your current spouse* have been previously married (*it does not matter when or where*), you will need the name, date of birth, country of birth, dates of marriage and divorce for **ALL** previous spouse(s). If you are not currently married, you also need to bring the divorce, death certificate, or annulment decree, of your last marriage. Bring a certified translation, if it's not in English.

Children – Information of **ALL** your children and step-children (it does not matter where they live, their age, or if they are deceased), including their dates of birth, current addresses, and alien (resident) number (if applicable).

Certificate of disposition issued by a court or the police – If you have *ever* been arrested, cited, detained, or given a summons, for any reason (including MTA or personal tickets), you will need the certificates of disposition for **ALL** of these arrests/tickets.

Taxes – If you are applying *on the basis of marriage* to a U.S. citizen, bring the IRS tax return transcript for the last 3 years with your name and your spouse's name. Call (800) 829-1040 for more information.

WARNING

Let us know if **any** of the following conditions apply to you

- In the last 5 years, you have traveled abroad for more than 180 days, or, within one year, you spent more than 180 days abroad
- You have *ever* been arrested, cited, detained, or given a summons, for any reason (including MTA, personal, or pending tickets)
- You have resided in another country since you became a Legal Permanent Resident
- You have never paid taxes, you owe taxes, or you have paid them as a non-resident
- You have been detained by an immigration officer, or you have had a deportation or exclusion process
- You owe child support
- You are male and lived in the United States between the ages of 18 and 26, but you never registered with the Selective Service
- You have registered to vote or voted in an election in the United States
